Dear Friends,

2021 was a great year for your Community Foundation! As we celebrated our 30th anniversary year, we reflected on past volunteers, donors, and the work of local nonprofit agencies that your philanthropy has funded (pages 4-5). It was wonderful to take a stroll down memory lane, but to also look forward to the great future that we have ahead of us as an organization.

When a group of community-minded people established our organization in 1991, they were presenting a concept of giving that was very new to most people in Jefferson County. Thirty years later, we certainly can see the power of the endowment model. A great example of that power is an endowment named the King's Daughters' Hospital/William G. Crosby Fund for Pediatrics.

This endowment was established in December 1992 by the Board of Directors at King's Daughters' Hospital, now known as Norton King's Daughters' Health (KDH), using a portion of the estate of William G. Crosby. The fund's purpose is to provide financial support to the Pediatrics Department, forever. In a Madison Courier story from December 22, 1992, then Hospital Board Chairwoman Brenda Eversole said, "We believe it is very important and prudent management, to set aside a portion of our legacy for the future. A part will be spent currently for equipment and other needs, but the \$50,000 will provide an annual income to the department forever. The Community Foundation's investment policy provides for the principal to grow with inflation so that the purchasing power of the income can be maintained over the years."

Since it was established with a \$50,000 donation, nearly \$75,000 in annual grants has been distributed to the KDH Pediatrics Department and the original \$50,000 of principal has grown to a current market value of over \$107,000. Mr. Crosby's name will forever be a part of the community and his legacy will support the work of the KDH Pediatrics Department for many generations.

When you choose to give to the Community Foundation, whether it is to establish your own fund (pages 8-13) or give to one of our existing funds (pages 14-17), you are helping us build FOREVER for Jefferson County.

In 2021, we still were cautiously waiting for the COVID-19 pandemic to end and did not hold any in-person events, but we were excited to award over \$400,000 in competitive grants and scholarships (pages 27-31).

Thank you to everyone who has supported our community through the foundation over the past 30 years. You are all a part of our history, our story, and our Community Foundation family. You are all a part of our 30 amazing years.



30 AMAZING YEARSIN JEFFERSON COUNTY

Thirty years ago, a small group of volunteers gathered to meet a challenge and to dream about Jefferson County's future. That small group's vision was to create an organization that would provide support to nonprofit organizations serving the residents of the community. That organization is now known as the Community Foundation of Madison and Jefferson County (CFMJC).

What began in 1991 with a \$500,000 matching grant from Lilly Endowment Inc.'s GIFT (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow) initiative has grown to exceed \$34 million in assets. Of course, in that 30-year span of time, the county, state, country, and world have seen ups and downs; but through it all, the Community Foundation has remained a constant.



Having the word "community" in the organization's name is key to describing the nature of its existence. As a 501(c)3 public charity, the Foundation is supported by donations from community members. Nearly 66% of all donations made in 2021 were \$100 and less, demonstrating that residents of all financial means can make a difference in the county in which they live, work, and play.

After receiving that support and growing those gifts through prudent stewardship, CFMJC makes grants each year to support a wide variety of needs in the community. Many may be familiar with some of the Foundation's larger grants, such as providing \$100,000 to support the creation of the Cancer Treatment Center at Norton King's Daughters' Health and granting \$150,000 to River Valley Resources for the creation of the Clearinghouse of Jefferson County. But throughout the last 30 years, the Foundation has supported youth activities and organizations, health and safety initiatives, historic preservation projects, and the creation of parks, just to name a few.

But collecting money from and granting money to the community is not the only way the Foundation connects to Jefferson County. The Community Foundation is seen as a community leader, with the input of the CFMJC staff members and Board of Directors often being sought during the planning and implementation phases of community projects, most recently including the Stellar Community designation and the creation of Resilient Jefferson County.

It is exciting to dream about what Jefferson County will be like in the next 30 years. Whatever the future may look like, the Community Foundation will still be here to provide support to the ever-changing needs of the residents of Jefferson County – For Good. Forever.

Permanent Planting of Art

A bright and shiny object caught her eye on the way to her dance class. She wanted to take a closer look, but her mom kept going. She stopped in her tracks and pulled back on her mom's hand, trying to lead her a few steps back. "Mom! Look at this!" The duo took a moment to look at the shining sculpture sitting in the small courtyard between the Community Foundation office and the 420 West apartment building.

Spring Awakening, created by metal sculptor and fabricator Dale Rogers, adds a pop of color and shine among the courtyard landscaped by River City Nursery. "I first met Dale and saw examples of his work at the 2018 Madison Chautauqua Festival of Art," said CFMJC President & CEO Bill Barnes. "I love birds and trees and thought that this sculpture would be perfect for the landscaped space north of our building." The eight-anda-half-foot tall sculpture is comprised of Cor-Ten Steel for the base and branches, stainless steel for the top, and steel for the three multi-color birds. These materials are made to sustain the sculpture's appearance over time and through the elements. This piece of public artwork sits almost directly across the street from the sculpture The Ties That Bind by former CFMJC Board Member Eric Phagan featured in Lytle Park.

Just as a real tree can provide enjoyment and shade for generations, it is the Community Foundation's hope that this tree will bring joy to those who look upon it for many years to come. That same joy that it provided for the tiny dancer, who even after practice, grabbed her mom's hand and guided her to look at the sculpture one more time before heading to their vehicle.

TOGETHER MAKING A DIFFERENCE

The Community Foundation has been collaborating with donors since 1991 to fund the causes they care about most. We are here because generous people were willing to create endowments that others can donate to in order to make a difference in our county. Two endowment examples of community members coming together to donate and create a lasting impact on Jefferson County are the Mike Hess Memorial Endowment and the Food for Students Fund.

Carrying On A Friend's Generosity

2021 marked the 10th anniversary of the creation of the Mike Hess Memorial Endowment. Mike was wellknown in the Hanover area, as not only a member of Southwestern High School's Class of '84, but also as the owner/operator of Mike's Service Center. He was passionate about several hobbies and enjoyed giving charitably to help youth in need afford extracurricular activities at school. One of those activities that Mike often helped cover was Prom and the expenses around it. His friends shared that Mike could often be seen in local restaurants on Prom night paying for students' meals.

Mike sadly passed away in August 2011 after a battle with Cancer. A group of his friends came together and held benefit events to remember their friend and to raise money for the endowment. In their first year, they raised \$12,411, exceeding the minimum \$5,000 needed to make it a permanent fund. This has now become an annual tradition! To date, over \$74,000 has been raised and given to the fund. Following the benefit, Mike's family members and friends meet with Community Foundation President & CEO Bill Barnes to discuss how to distribute grants from the endowment and the extra money raised at the benefit. Over the past 10 years, \$12,640 has been granted to cover Prom and After-Prom event costs and student Prom expenses at Madison Consolidated and Southwestern High Schools, as well as the Dress a Student Closet at Southwestern.

It's hard to estimate just how many people have donated to the Mike Hess Memorial Endowment because, many times, the donations are made at the benefits with cash. But what we do know is that these folks have and will continue to make an impact on the lives of students in our county. That has been the most important thing to Mike's friends, knowing that what they've started by collecting various dollar amounts of donations from many people will last forever and be a self-sustaining legacy at the Community Foundation.

Strength In Numbers, Near And Far

It seems that there are now endless ways to connect and communicate with those around us near and far. Social media platforms like Instagram and Facebook are avenues that individuals and organizations use to get the word out about important milestones. Elijah Chandler harnessed the power of Instagram to reach out to friends and family across the country to let them know about the Food for Students Fund he was starting as an Acorn Fund in February 2021. His vision for the fund was to help alleviate student lunch debt in Jefferson County's public schools. (Read more about Eli and the creation of this fund on page 8).

By posting short, one-minute videos, he told his followers how they could help, and he posted updates on the fund's progress in reaching the establishing minimum dollar amount. In just six weeks, Eli and his friends, family, and followers gave enough to reach the \$5,000 needed to become a Designated Endowment.

Overwhelmed by and grateful for this outpouring of support, Eli wanted to keep the momentum going and to provide immediate relief to the schools. He rallied his followers once again to donate in the summer before school started. Over \$1,000 was granted to the public schools to help with outstanding student lunch debt.

In December, Eli partnered with the Red Roaster Coffee and Eatery to help with their annual Sock Drive for the Salvation Army. For each \$10 donated to the **Food for Students Fund**,

Eli donated a pair of new socks. In total, 418 pairs of socks were donated by Eli and others in the community, with \$955 being raised for the endowment. Throughout last year, the majority of the donations to the Food for Students Fund were made via credit card through the Foundation's online giving portal. A few donors are currently taking advantage of the monthly recurring donation option available on the site.

Though they were established 10 years apart, the Mike Hess Memorial Endowment and the Food for Students Fund show how you don't have to have thousands of dollars to start a fund, just a community of people willing to support a common goal and give to what they care about.



In 2021, the Community Foundation had 13 new endowments established. Read on to find out more about our different endowment types and about the donors who established these new funds.

Designated Funds

Designated Funds provide donors the ability to create a steady stream of income to one or more specific charities — forever. The minimum amount to establish a Designated Fund is \$5,000.

Food For Students Fund

Elijah Chandler established this Designated
Endowment as a great way to give back to the
community that has been so good to him throughout
his life. A graduate of Madison Consolidated High
School, Eli wanted to be able to help the public
schools in Jefferson County so the students, and
their parents, can be as successful as possible.
He has a passion for food, and one of his greatest joys
in life is cooking with his daughter. Food insecurity
is a growing problem in our region, and studies show
that students perform better with proper nutrition.
Annual grants from this fund will help public schools
in Jefferson County assist students and families with
lunch expenses.







Ohio Theatre Endowment

The historic Ohio Theatre is a valued piece of Madison's Main Street district. The Ohio has been here for decades of first dates and kiddie cartoons, and Jarrett Boyd hopes it will continue to be an anchor for downtown Madison. With that in mind, she established this Designated Fund because she sees the theatre's value not only for the "picture shows," but as a venue for local theatrical groups, speakers, or musicians. Imagine the possibility of an annual film festival! Jarrett has a warm place in her heart for the small-town movie due to earning spending money working the concession stand (like the one at the Ohio) during her junior year of high school. Annual grants from this fund will be made to the Friends of the Ohio Theatre organization to support the Ohio Theatre for years to come.

Donor Advised Funds

Donor Advised Funds allow donors to recommend the charitable organizations that benefit from the fund's annual distribution. Donor Advised Funds are a cost-effective and efficient alternative to a private or family foundation. The minimum amount to establish a Donor Advised Fund is \$5,000.

Rob and Michele Barlow Charitable Endowment

This Donor Advised Fund was established by Rob and Michele Barlow. As long-time residents of Madison and Jefferson County, Rob and Michele have given back to many community and nonprofit organizations, local schools, and service clubs, either financially or through their volunteer efforts. Each year, the Barlows will designate grants from this fund to the causes and organizations they care about the most.



Bill Demaree Memorial Endowment

Julie Demaree and Kiran Somashekara created this Donor Advised Fund to remember Julie's father, the late Bill Demaree. Bill was a lifelong Madisonian who enjoyed serving his family, friends, and community. For over 50 years, he was the owner of Bill Demaree Realty, and had served on the Madison City Council for nine years. Through this fund, Julie, Kiran, and their family will select the charities to benefit from the fund's annual grants, giving them maximum flexibility with their philanthropy and honoring Bill's legacy.

Joseph T. and Ruby W. Craig Fund for Learning

This Donor Advised Fund was created to honor Joseph and Ruby Craig by their daughters Nancy Jacobs, and her husband Curt, Martha Clancy, and her husband Jack, and Margaret Hillery. Joe and Ruby recognized the importance of learning, and as teachers, they helped educate thousands of Jefferson County children. Growing up in Jefferson and Scott Counties, they learned skills from their parents that proved invaluable in supporting their families, neighbors, and communities. From gardening to



plumbing, food preservation to ham radio, and sewing to small machine repair, Joe and Ruby were always prepared and willing to lend their help. More importantly, they were always willing to take the time to help others learn a needed skill so that in the future, they would be prepared to help themselves and those around them. To continue this legacy, the family will annually select the organizations and projects to benefit from the fund's grant dollars, with an emphasis on supporting learning opportunities.

Schafer Family Philanthropy Fund

Many generations of the Schafer family have been fortunate to call Jefferson County home. Over the years, they have come together as a family to support many organizations and programs benefitting area residents. To make sure that this legacy of giving back to the community continues, members of the Schafer family have established this Donor Advised Fund. Each year, the family will select the causes that will benefit from the fund's grants.





Doug and JoAnne Spiller Family Endowment

This Donor Advised Fund was established by Doug and JoAnne Spiller. The Spillers created this endowment as a way to give to the causes their family cares about for many years to come. They have volunteered for various organizations and support the important work they do in our community. Each year, Doug and JoAnne will designate which charitable organizations will benefit from the fund's annual grants.

Tony and Hilary Steinhardt III Community Fund

The Steinhardt family has a long history of community service to Madison. Tony and Hilary Steinhardt III continue the family tradition by establishing a Donor Advised Fund to make a lasting impact on the quality of life in Madison. Each year, Tony and Hilary will select organizations with broad community impact to benefit from the fund's grants, giving them maximum flexibility in their philanthropy.





Field of Interest Funds

Field of Interest Funds provide support to a donor's particular area of interest. The Community Foundation staff, Grants Committee, and Board of Directors identify projects that elevate and support these specialized interests. The minimum amount to establish a Field of Interest Fund is \$5,000.

World Languages and International Studies Endowment

It is easier than ever to connect with others around the world through the avenues of education, travel, and business, to name a few. Pam Alsop Sandoz cherishes the memories she's made throughout her career in the global financial and international trade sectors, but also in her time as a French teacher, student, and tourist. With that in mind, she established this Field of Interest Fund to support experiences and/or training that helps Jefferson County students, teachers, individuals, and/or organizations gain expertise and proficiency in foreign languages, English as a second language, and/or international studies.

Flexible Community Funds

Flexible Community Funds give the Community Foundation the flexibility to assist nonprofits annually through grants. Through these funds, donors create a lasting legacy to fulfill the ever-changing needs and dreams of the people of Jefferson County. The minimum amount to establish a Flexible Community Fund is \$5,000.



Tim and Kim Breeding Family Endowment

This Flexible Community Fund was established by Tim and Kim Breeding. Tim and Kim have financially supported many community organizations over the years, personally and through their businesses, Teton Corporation and M&M. They have also volunteered at the Community Foundation for many years, including Tim's service as Board Chair in 2010, and Kim participating in the Women's Giving Circle. Annual grants from this fund will be utilized during the Foundation's competitive grants cycle to address the current needs of Jefferson County.

Kevin and Mary Kay McCubbin Endowment

The McCubbin family has been giving back to the Madison community for several generations. As president of McCubbin Motors, Kevin has supported many charities and organizations over the years and has served on the Board of the Salvation Army. Mary Kay has been involved in our Catholic Schools as former president of the Friends of Shawe and Pope John. She has been involved in



the community, serving currently as a member of the Board of Directors for King's Daughters' and Tri-Chair for the KDH Cancer Center Fundraising Campaign in 2015. Her most recent volunteer efforts led to the formation and creation of the Madison Sport Court, a public multi-sport Center completed in 2020. To honor and continue that legacy, Kevin and Mary Kay McCubbin established this Flexible Community Fund. Annual grants from this fund will be used to address the immediate and ever-changing needs of nonprofit organizations in Jefferson County.

Agency Funds

In addition to the funds mentioned previous, we also offer Agency Funds. Agency Funds provide an avenue for nonprofit organizations to invest their own money and create a perpetual stream of support for their mission. The minimum amount to establish an Agency Fund is \$5,000.



Scholarship Funds

Scholarship Funds support local students pursuing their academic goals following high school. The minimum amount to establish a scholarship fund is \$20,000.

Cheatham Family Scholarship

Robert and Mildred Cheatham were lifelong Madisonians who loved their community and raised their family here. Their sons, Gene, Buck, Tuck, Bardo, and Larry, along with their daughters, Thelma Wehner, Dot Sands, and Nancy Lee, were lifelong citizens who made significant contributions to our fair city. To honor their legacy, the family created a scholarship fund to be awarded to a Madison Consolidated High School senior wishing to further their studies at a post-secondary institution.



Ralph and Margaret Seifert Madison Rotary Club Scholarship

The Madison Rotary Club established this Scholarship Fund in memory of long-time Rotarians Ralph and Margaret Seifert. Ralph and Margaret had a love for service and education, with Ralph serving as a professor at Hanover College for over 35 years, and Margaret serving in multiple roles at Hanover College and Ivy Tech Community College. To honor their memory, this scholarship will be awarded to a Jefferson County student intending to further their education at an institution of higher learning.

LEADERSHIP JEFFERSON COUNTY

Established in 2017, Leadership Jefferson County (LJC) is a bi-weekly, 10 session course comprised of topics to give participants a better understanding of resources and relationships in Jefferson County. The program was created as an action project of the "Building a Positive Community Through Collaboration & Leadership" initiative of the Envision Jefferson County project. That initiative was one of six created through community conversations and surveys hosted by the Envision team. Topics covered by the course include:

Business & Economics • Education • Government Agencies & Organizations • Healthcare History • Industry & Agriculture • Nonprofits & Volunteerism • Social Services • Tourism

Each year, the Community Foundation hosts the Nonprofits & Volunteerism session. CFMJC President & CEO Bill Barnes walks participants through an overview of what it means to be a 501(c)3 charitable organization and highlights healthy governance practices. Two local nonprofit organizations, the Jefferson County United Way and the Friends of Hargan-Matthews Park, visit the class to share more about their missions and programs.

Graduates of LJC have enjoyed their experiences and the knowledge they have gained about the community. Inaugural 2018 Class graduate Chris Mattern said, "Leadership Jefferson County was nothing short of life changing. I came into the program wanting to learn how to be more involved in the community and I left not only involved, but motivated to be a part of positive change and growth in Jefferson County." 2019 Class graduate Josh Hershberger echoed Chris' sentiments by saying, "Leadership Jefferson County was an invaluable experience and helped me better understand the various sectors in our community (such as government, healthcare, nonprofits, education, etc.) and how they work together to encourage growth and build a thriving community. I highly recommend this program for anyone that is committed to this area and wants to keep Jefferson County a remarkable place to work and live."

The Leadership Jefferson County course was placed on hiatus from mid-March 2020 through the entirety of 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Fortunately, the course has begun again for 2022. Members of the 2020 class have been invited to complete the course by attending the classes that were canceled for them because of the pandemic. LJC greatly appreciates Grote Industries, LLC and their continued sponsorship of our end-of-course celebration and luncheon in May.

The future looks bright as the LJC graduates and current participants continue to be examples of engaged and connected community members of Jefferson County.

WOMEN'S GIVING CIRCLE

10 Years of Empowering Women to Make a Difference

The Women's Giving Circle of Jefferson County (WGCJC) celebrated its 10th Anniversary in 2021! Formed in 2012 by 12 local women, the WGCJC is a community of philanthropic women of all ages and backgrounds. By combining their financial strength, these women collectively make a positive change for women and children throughout Jefferson County through the following goals:

- Make a significant difference in the community by empowering women to contribute time, talents, and monetary resources to the needs of women, children, and families
- Educate and increase awareness of the needs of local women, children, and families
- Provide social opportunities, events, and exposure for women in our community

All women in Jefferson County are welcome and invited to join. Membership consists of an annual tax-deductible contribution of \$100. Each membership has 75% placed in a pass-through field of interest fund, while the remaining 25% is invested in the Women's Giving Circle Endowment in Memory of Bonnie Hare permanent fund. Junior Memberships are available for young ladies ages 18 and under for \$50 and are split \$25/\$25. At the end of 2021, the WGCJC Endowment had a value of \$144,166. All assets of the WGCJC are held and maintained at the Community Foundation of Madison and Jefferson County.

How We Give

The WGCJC makes grants annually to organizations that have the greatest potential to help the women and children of Jefferson County. Grants are focused on the following four fields of interest, with the specific purpose of benefitting women and/or children:

- Education
- Economic Empowerment
- · Physical and Mental Health
- Violence and Crime Prevention

The Grants Sub-Circle reviews applications and provides grant recommendations to the general membership, which then votes on the recommendations at the annual meeting/dinner in April. Since its creation, the WGCJC has granted \$184,699 to nonprofit organizations serving the women and children of Jefferson County.

Cheers To 10 Years!

In the past 10 years, the WGCJC has reached other impressive stats including:

- 493 different women have been members of the WGCJC
- 63 women have been members for all 10 years
- The highest number of members in a year is 274 in 2017

It is clear that our local community of women has a deep love of helping those in need. Here's to 10 (and many more) years of the Women's Giving Circle of Jefferson County! The Women's Giving Circle of Jefferson County finished 2021 with 205 members! From the membership dollars and extra donations collected, \$15,600 in grants were awarded to five nonprofit organizations that serve women and/or children in Jefferson County.

GRANTS

Since its creation in 1991, the Community Foundation of Madison and Jefferson County has invested over \$15 million back into Jefferson County through grants and scholarships. In 2021, the Community Foundation granted a total of \$884,421 from its endowments, with over \$248,000 of that total coming from Flexible Community Funds and Field of Interest Funds.

"Our grants committee is often asked for more than twice the amount that we have available to grant during our annual competitive grant cycle," said CFMJC President & CEO Bill Barnes. "Thanks to donors who have entrusted grantmaking decisions to the Foundation through a Flexible Community Fund, we're pleased to be able to make a significant impact and fund a diverse range of programs and projects that will benefit residents across all of Jefferson County."

To be considered for funding through the annual Competitive Grant Cycle, local nonprofit agencies submitted an online application. Selected finalists were then emailed any additional questions from members of the Foundation's Grants Committee to learn more about the organizations, their projects, and goals.

Leveraging Local Dollars

In its 30-year history, the Community Foundation has been fortunate to provide lead grants that have helped organizations receive not only local support, but money from foundations outside of Jefferson County, as well as state and federal grants. When applying for those grants, showing that a project is supported by a community foundation can often raise the status of the application. Last year, CFMJC provided grants that are prime examples of two organizations leveraging local dollars. CFMJC asked Elizabeth Auxier with the Friends of the Ohio Theatre and Kay Stokes with the Hanover-Madison Connector Trail to share about how the Community Foundation has helped their respective projects move forward.

CFMJC: Briefly tell us about the project for which you received a 2021 Community Foundation grant.

Elizabeth Auxier (EA): This grant funded an interior architectural study, including conceptual drawings and detailed construction and design plans for the Ohio Theatre. It builds on the first grant we received in 2016 from the Foundation for a feasibility study.

Kay Stokes (KS): When it is completed, the Hanover-Madison Connector Trail (HMCT) will stretch six miles from the Town of Hanover and Hanover College to Clifty Falls State Park, the Heritage Trail and downtown Madison. It will travel down the hillside behind the college and then skirt the edge of the IKE Clifty Creek Power Plant property before paralleling SR 56/Clifty Hollow Drive. At the base of Hanover Beach Hill Road, the trail also will connect with CR 310W, allowing another 8 miles of scenic hiking and biking along the Ohio River.

CFMJC: How has receiving this grant and any previous grants from the Foundation helped your organization in your fundraising efforts for this project, especially state and/or federal dollars?

EA: The feasibility study was extremely helpful with securing additional dollars, especially because it was a lead gift that we used as matching dollars for additional grants from Indiana Landmarks and the National Trust. The grant and support of the foundation gave credibility to our project, in the beginning, and motivated others to donate, particularly Arvin Sango's contribution of \$75,000. The data obtained from the study is still used as we write grants. In addition, we received a \$250,000 grant from the Redevelopment Commission, using information from the study. This allowed us to repair masonry, install HV/AC and replace the roof. As a result, the Ohio Theatre is more structurally sound than it has been in decades. We secured a \$40,000 grant from the DNR Historical Preservation Fund, as a result of the foundation's most recent gift. Other grant requests are still pending.

KS: The Community Foundation's \$28,000 grant funded a scoping study by Schmidt Associates of Indianapolis, which developed a preliminary route and cost estimates. The scoping study formed the basis of an Indiana Next Level Trails (NLT) application for Phase 1 of the HMCT, which will run from the Heritage Trail and downtown Madison to Clifty Falls State Park. The study was absolutely essential. We could not have applied for the NLT grant without it. Thanks to the Community Foundation, we received a grant for \$2.16 million from NLT. We now will use the Next Level Trails funds to leverage approximately \$960,000 (as of press time) in additional funding from the Our Southern Indiana Regional Development Authority's READI grant initiative.

CFMJC: How will the completion of your project impact Jefferson County and its residents?

EA: The feasibility study was the first big step toward raising funds for repairs to the Ohio Theatre. It also gave us direction and a multi-year plan for rehabilitating and operating the Ohio Theatre. Every project we finish gets us closer to a complete renovation that will expand to the building to the west, better serving more community members and visitors. The architectural and design drawings will bring our vision to life and help show donors and the community what we plan to accomplish.

KS: The Our Southern Indiana Regional Development Authority is working to create a world-class greenway system that will connect the five-county region and the greater Louisville area. Madison and Hanover could become trail heads for a system that would allow residents and visitors to bike or hike all the way into Louisville along the Ohio River. A destination trail of this caliber would draw people from all over the world. What a great benefit for Jefferson County residents who could use the trail every day, as well as for business, tourism, and regional development.

CFMJC: The Community Foundation just celebrated its 30th Anniversary. What do you hope to see your organization/project accomplish in the next 30 years?

EA: Our hope is that future generations will continue to experience the joy brought by access to the arts. We will expand programming beyond movies and concerts. The Ohio Theatre will be the region's premier multi-use arts venue and will be known outside of the Midwest as a venue where national acts want to perform.

KS: Thirty years from now, I hope we have not only the Hanover-Madison Connector Trail, but also have a connection to a regional network of trails that lets us bike all over southern Indiana.


