FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Applying for scholarships can seem like a daunting task. Here are some frequently asked questions to help you as you consider applying for our scholarships.

What kinds of scholarships are available from the Community Foundation? Am I eligible?

The local graduating seniors of the Class of 2025 were awarded over \$230,000 in scholarships. Nearly 50 different students earned money toward their college costs. Scholarships are available to a variety of applicants. Some awards are specific to schools, majors, financial need, or other interests. Others have few restrictions. Check out the [Available Scholarships Listing](#) on Page 6 to see what you may be eligible for!

What about the annual Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship?

Jefferson County is given one Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship each year, awarding full tuition to an Indiana college or university. The application is open to Jefferson County, IN seniors in the top 10% of their graduating class (minimum three per school). The window for applying lasts from early July until mid-August, and the winner is announced in December. How do I submit an application?

After December 1, go to our website, www.cfmjc.org, and hover over the [Grants & Scholarships](#) tab in the menu on the left side of the page, then click [Scholarships](#). On the Scholarship page, click [Apply](#) in the menu at the top of the page. This will take you to our online application system. Click the [Log On/Create an Account to Apply](#) button in the upper right corner. You will fill out the registration form to create an account with an email and password. Be sure to use an email that is not issued by your high school and is one that you will consistently monitor, and save your password for future visits. Be sure to save administrator@grantinterface.com to your Safe Sender list to receive email communications about your application.



Do I have to have SAT or ACT scores to apply for scholarships?

Many of the scholarships consider standardized test scores. While these are not required, their absence will likely put you at a disadvantage when reviewers are comparing candidates. Counselors are asked to include your PSAT scores if your SAT or ACT scores are unavailable.

Do I have to fill out the FAFSA before I apply for your scholarships?

Most of our scholarships require you to provide the SAI (Student Aid Index), formerly EFC, figure from your FAFSA. However, not all of the scholarships have a need-based requirement. Look at the [Available Scholarships Listing](#) to see which scholarships require this information. You can complete your FAFSA online at www.studentaid.gov.

Will I need to write an essay?

Some scholarships require essays for consideration. Be sure to check the [Available Scholarships Listing](#) to see what you need to include. See tips for essays on Page 23.

What about letters of recommendation?

Many scholarships require references or letters of recommendation from people like teachers, coaches, or employers. You will be prompted to complete needed [Request](#) sections on your application which will alert your recommender to your request via email. It is your responsibility to ask for these pieces well in advance as **they are due at the same time as your application**. You will not be able to see the information or letters submitted on your behalf, but you will be emailed when they are completed. Counselors will also submit transcripts at your request.

What if I don't have everything completed by the submission deadline?

All student information and recommendations **MUST** be submitted on the online application platform before **Noon on February 6, 2026**. Please remember to give your references plenty of time to complete and submit letters of recommendation. (If a recommendation is not received, you will be ineligible for that scholarship, but may still be awarded others not requiring that particular recommendation). It is the responsibility of the applicant to make sure all materials are completed and the **SUBMIT** button is pressed before this time. Your school counselor will have additional time to submit your transcript. Partial applications will not be considered.

What is the timeline for the scholarship application process?

December 1, 2025	Applications open at Midnight
February 6, 2026	Noon deadline to submit applications
February 10, 2026	Counselor deadline for transcripts
Winners will be announced at schools' Honors Day programs and at the Community Foundation's Scholarship Celebration event on May 11, 2026.	

Are 21st Century Scholars eligible to apply for these scholarships?

Indiana's 21st Century Scholars receive full tuition to any Indiana **public** college or university. Because some of the scholarships listed are for tuition only, you may not be eligible to apply for some awards. Take a look at the [Available Scholarships Listing](#) to see which awards you might still be able to apply for.

*full-tuition scholarships include, but are not limited to: 21st Century Scholar (at a public university), tuition exchange, military appointments, athletic, academic, or other full-tuition scholarships.

Are scholarships renewable?

The majority of the scholarships are awarded for the first semester of your college enrollment only. Check the [Available Scholarships Listing](#) to see which scholarships are renewable. These scholarships renew automatically upon an annual confirmation of your enrollment, and funds are sent directly to your school by August 1.

What schools may I attend?

Some scholarships are awarded only to a specific school or have some other limiting factor such as in-state, or public vs. private. The majority of the scholarships, however, can be applied to any accredited two or four year college, university, vocational, or trade school.

If I win a scholarship, what can the money be used for?

CFMJC scholarships may be used for undergraduate tuition, or tuition and related expenses (books, equipment, fees, etc.) at qualifying colleges and universities. If a school applies a scholarship to a student's Room and Board expenses, there may be income tax implications that would need to be discussed with the school. Be sure to check out the specifics in the [Available Scholarships Listing](#).

What is the difference between a public and a private college or university?

Public colleges and universities receive the majority of their monetary support from the state government, while private colleges and universities are supported by donations from alumni, endowment funds created by the school, and student tuition and fees. We have included a list of Indiana colleges and universities and their public/private status starting on Page 26 of this guide.

What if I win one of the scholarships?

Most winners will be announced on May 11, 2026 at the Community Foundation's Scholarship Celebration and/or at school ceremonies. Award recipients will receive an official award letter containing specifics of the scholarship and instructions on how to accept the award. Award recipients must complete an assigned online acceptance form. Scholarship checks will be mailed directly to the colleges by August 1. If you drop out of school, any refund will return to the Foundation. If you decide to transfer, the money can generally go to the new school. You must contact the Foundation office to discuss any transfers of scholarships.

AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIPS



BE SURE TO READ THESE IMPORTANT NOTES BEFORE STARTING YOUR APPLICATION!

1. **Applications will open to students on Monday, December 1, 2025.** A link to online applications will be available on the Scholarship page of www.cfmjc.org.
2. The deadline to submit completed applications online is **Friday, February 6, 2026 at NOON** unless otherwise noted. Scholarships using other applications may have different deadlines. Please review the deadlines and requirements for each scholarship. **Applications and/or recommendations received after the stated deadline WILL NOT be considered.**
3. Scholarships including Financial Need in the criteria will require the applicant to **upload a PDF of the Student Aid Index (SAI), formerly EFC, page from the student's most recent FAFSA before the scholarship deadline.** Go to studentaid.gov to complete your financial aid information. You will need your family's most recent (2024) tax information among other documentation.
4. **Scholarship awards are for tuition and/or tuition related expenses only at the undergraduate level.** Students already receiving a full-tuition award from a college or another source (i.e. full-tuition athletic or academic scholarship, 21st Century Scholarship at a public institution, tuition exchange, military academy appointment) may not be eligible to receive Community Foundation scholarships.
5. Scholarship awards are generally for graduating high school seniors and are not renewable, unless otherwise noted.
6. Community Foundation employees, board members, and selection committee volunteers, as well as family members of the aforementioned individuals, are ineligible for Community Foundation scholarships, with the exception of merit-based scholarships not requiring an application. Ineligible family members include spouses, lineal descendants and their spouses, siblings and their spouses. The period of ineligibility extends through the calendar year following the year in which the volunteer position or employment ends.
7. Scholarship awards are mailed directly to the recipients' selected schools **by August 1. Student and school information must be submitted online to the Community Foundation by mid-June.**
8. It is the responsibility of the applicant to confirm that all parts of the application are accurate, completed, and submitted before the deadline. This includes, but is not limited to, submission of recommendation letters and addressing technical issues.

BONNIE & PRINTIS SHELTON SCHOLARSHIP



ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School, Southwestern High School, or Trimble County High School; 2) **be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university; and 3) rank in the top 20% of their graduating class.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$7,000 | 1 scholarship, renewable at \$3,500 in each freshman & sophomore years

BRAD O'LEARY SCHOLARSHIP



ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; 3) **have taken at least 3 years of Spanish class; 4) received grades of "C" or better in Spanish classes; and 5) are interested in the Spanish language.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Spanish class academic achievement and financial need. Preference given to applicants who have participated in Spanish speaking activities such as mission trips, tutoring, Hispanic Festival, etc.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$700 | 1 scholarship

BRIAN W. STITES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Southwestern High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; 3) **have a GPA of 2.0 and above; and 4) plans to play on the Southwestern Varsity Baseball team in their senior year.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement. Financial need will be considered in the event of a tie.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,200 | 1 scholarship

BROADWAY SCHOOL ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP



ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of a Jefferson County, Indiana High School; and 2) **be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, concern for school and community, essay, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: 1) 200 word essay on the role the Broadway High School (the first commissioned colored high school in the state of Indiana, located in the 600 block of North Broadway Street) played in the history of Madison; and 2) FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,100 | 1 scholarship

CALVIN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP



ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School or Southwestern High School; 2) **be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited four year college or university; 3) planning to major in education with the intent of teaching in a K-12 public school; and 4) have a GPA of 3.0 or above.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, academic honors and awards, extracurricular and community involvement, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: 1) Essay of up to 250 words describing why the applicant wishes to become a teacher; 2) Scoring form completed by an academic teacher; 3) 2 letters of recommendation (one from an English teacher and one from an academic teacher of another discipline); and 4) FAFSA SAI PDF upload

CAM CAR CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of any accredited Jefferson County, Indiana High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited public or private institution of higher learning; and **3) planning to pursue a degree or certificate in automotive technology, diesel technology, collision repair and refinishing, or other programs related to the automotive industry (or most closely satisfies this requirement).**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic performance and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,750 | 1 scholarship

CARL J. & MARY M. HOEFLING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; **3) have a GPA of 2.0 and above; and 4) attended MCHS for 4 years.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, essay, and personal interview (by invitation)

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: A 250 word essay describing why the student wants to attend college/vocational school, their school choices, and their career and life goals. Personal interviews will be conducted by invitation only.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$5,065 | 1 scholarship

CAROLYN BRUCE SPICER & GENE E. SPICER NURSING SCHOLARSHIP (HIGH SCHOOL)

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; **2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university; 3) planning to pursue an Associate or Bachelor's degree in nursing; and 4) have a GPA of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, extracurricular involvement, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,100 | 1 scholarship

CAROLYN BRUCE SPICER & GENE E. SPICER NURSING SCHOLARSHIP (ADULT LEARNER)

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: **1) be a registered nurse with an Associate degree in nursing; 2) graduated with their Associate degree with a GPA of 2.0 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale; 3) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university; 4) planning to pursue a Bachelor's degree in nursing; and 5) reside in any of the following counties in Indiana or Kentucky: Carroll (KY), Clark (IN), Jefferson (IN), Jennings (IN), Ripley (IN), Scott (IN), Switzerland (IN), or Trimble (KY).**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic performance, work history, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,100 | 1 scholarship

CHAN CHILTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; **3) have a GPA of 2.5 and above; and 4) participated in two or more boys' varsity sports during their high school career.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement. Preference given to applicants who have exemplified teamwork, excelled in sportsmanship, demonstrated an outstanding work ethic, shown respect and consideration to others, practiced unselfishness, and maintained an exceptional citizenship record during high school.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,500 | 1 scholarship

CHARLES H. & C. CHRIS KELLER SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School or Shawe Memorial High School; **2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited technical or trade school, or two year college (NOT four year); and 3) have a GPA of 2.0 and above.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement and extracurricular activities

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$400 | 1 scholarship

CHEATHAM FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; **3) have a GPA of 2.5 and above; 4) have at least one varsity letter in an IHSAA sanctioned sport; and 5) have a family member who is a graduate of MCHS.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Extracurricular and community involvement, family members who have graduated from MCHS, athletic participation, character

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: Two letters of recommendations (at least one must be from a coach)

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,000 | 1 scholarship

CHRISTIE CRAFTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be graduating seniors of Southwestern High School or New Washington High School; **2) be accepted into and planning to attend a four year college or university in Indiana; and 3) plan to pursue a degree in primary or secondary education, or a related profession that serves children, such as social services or nursing.**

APPLICANTS RECEIVING FULL-TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY.

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement. Financial need will be considered in the event of a tie.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$850 per school | 1 scholarship per school

CLASS OF '84 SCHOLARSHIP & FRANCES K. EISAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; and 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school.

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,300 | 1 scholarship

CURTIS WRIGHT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; **2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited four year college or university to pursue a baccalaureate degree; and 3) have participated in cross country and/or swimming during high school.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, academic honors and community involvement

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: Letter of recommendation from a coach or administrator in the MCHS Athletic Department

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,600 | 1 scholarship

CUSTER ORATORY CONTEST SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be graduating seniors of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be planning to attend any accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational or trade school; and **3) participate in the Custer Oratorical Contest at MCHS.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Participation in the Custer Oratorical Contest

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$550 merit award per contestant | 2 scholarships - 1st place=\$2,790; 2nd place=\$1,860

DALE MCNEELY SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Southwestern High School; and 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school.

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement, community service, and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$32,300 | 1 scholarship, renewable at \$8,075 for 4 years

DALLAS LAMB VISUAL ARTS AND ARTS & CRAFTS SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any two or four-year college or university, vocational or trade school; and **3) be planning to further their education in the visual arts or arts & crafts (or most closely satisfies this requirement).**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Essay and letter of recommendation

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: 1) Essay of up to 250 words describing the student’s specific career/vocational goals with respect to the visual arts and/or arts & crafts; 2) 3-5 digital images of artwork and/or crafts; and 3) a letter of recommendation from an individual knowledgeable about the student’s skills and accomplishments

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,000 | 1 scholarship

DENNIS HOLT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; **3) have a GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale; and 4) played Girls’ basketball for one or more years during their high school career.**

21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS OR STUDENTS RECEIVING OTHER FULL-TUITION AWARDS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY.

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$1,500 | 1 scholarship

DEPUTY ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be graduating seniors of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school; **3) attended Deputy Elementary School for at least one year; and 4) currently reside in Graham Township.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Academic achievement and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: 1) 2 letters of recommendation from teachers and/or counselors of MCHS; 2) PDF upload of acceptance letter into a program for post high school education; and 3) FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$4,200 | Multiple scholarships may be awarded from this total amount

DOROTHY B. LOTZ SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be graduating seniors of Madison Consolidated High School; and 2) be accepted into and planning to attend any accredited two or four year college or university, vocational or trade school.

CRITERIA EVALUATED: Class rank. SAT/ACT scores and academic class load will be considered in the event of a tie.

NO APPLICATION REQUIRED

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$2,150 per student | 2 scholarships

DR. FRED S. HENDERSON SCHOLARSHIP

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be a graduating senior of Madison Consolidated High School; 2) be planning to attend any accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational or trade school; and **3) have an interest in studying math, science, or engineering at the next level.**

CRITERIA EVALUATED: High academic achievement in science and math and financial need

REQUIRED SUPPORTING MATERIALS: FAFSA SAI PDF upload

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: \$2,000 | 1 scholarship

DR. HARVE E. & JOYCE E. RAWSON ENDOWMENT

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must: 1) be residents of Jefferson County, IN; and 2) be enrolled at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana.

LILLY ENDOWMENT COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

For Jefferson County, Indiana, there is one (1) four-year, full-tuition scholarship available, and includes a \$900 yearly stipend for required books and equipment to an Indiana nonprofit college or university. The remaining selected finalists for the scholarship will each receive a \$1,500 Scholar Award from the Community Foundation. The annual online application period is from July–August, with the winner announced in December.

- 7) complete the online application provided by the Community Foundation

Independent Colleges of Indiana, Inc. (ICI) administers the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Program statewide. ICI is a nonprofit corporation that represents 29 regionally accredited degree granting, nonprofit, private colleges and universities in the state. The scholarships are a result of a statewide Lilly Endowment initiative to: 1) help raise the level of educational attainment in Indiana; 2) increase awareness of the beneficial roles Indiana community foundations can play in their communities; and 3) encourage and support the efforts of current and past Lilly Endowment Community Scholars to engage with each other and with Indiana business, governmental, educational, nonprofit and civic leaders to improve the quality of life in Indiana generally and in local communities in the state.

- 2) Good character, the capacity to make a meaningful contribution to society through work/activity involvement, and the ability to represent well the Community Foundation of Madison & Jefferson County, Inc. and the Jefferson County community
- 3) Letters of Recommendation
- 4) Selected Finalists will write a timed essay and participate in an interview

Tips on Applying for Community Foundation Scholarships

The Community Foundation operates two scholarship cycles: The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship from July 1 to mid-August and the general scholarship cycle from December 1 to early-February.

Students must complete our online application to be considered for our scholarships. To access the application platform, click the Apply link in the top menu of the Scholarships page of www.cfmjc.org. Applicants have the ability to preview the application questions. To begin an application, click the Log On/Create an Account to Apply button in the top right corner, then follow the registration instructions. Set up your account with an email address that you monitor frequently and that was not issued by your high school. You can save your progress as you go, but ALL parts of the application must be completed and submitted before the deadline to be considered for our scholarships.

Below are some tips for making your application stand out:

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

- Read each section and each question carefully and complete as directed.
- Proofread your answers thoroughly; don't omit any parts.
- When ready, hit the SUBMIT button; on our main application, you will then receive a confirmation page listing the scholarships you are eligible for, followed by a list of those scholarships requiring additional information. Follow the provided instructions to complete and submit these additional portions.

FILL OUT THE APPLICATION

- Gather necessary information like contact information and financial data.
- Complete your FAFSA; the majority of scholarships require this, even if you get no federal aid.
- Identify recommenders and get their contact information.
- Create an activity resume (see more information on Pages 23 and 24).
- Hang on to your username and password for logging in; you will need it again in the spring if you win an award in order to complete needed forms.
- Be sure to look for notification emails from administrator@grantinterface.com in your Inbox or Spam/Junk folder.
- Use of AI to complete essays or any part of the application is considered inappropriate.

ESSAYS

- A number of scholarships require you to write a short essay. Don't avoid a potential scholarship because of this requirement. An extra hour or two of work is well worth the effort if you win!
- When you write the essay, think about what can make you stand out. Don't just write what you think the reviewer wants to hear. Everyone else is doing that!
- Be sure to revise and edit your essay before you submit it. Take advantage of feedback and revisions from a trusted editor.
- Proofread, proofread, proofread!

REFERENCES/LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- Choose your references wisely. Who would be most likely to give you a strong recommendation? Who knows your skills and abilities best?
- Ask your recommenders ahead of time if they will be willing to help you. Be sure to get accurate contact information and type their email correctly in the appropriate request box.
- Some letters of recommendation requests in the application are shared by multiple available scholarships. You will fill out that request section once. Be sure to read the section instructions to see if it is a letter of recommendation that will cover multiple scholarships!
- Let your recommenders know to look in their Inbox or Spam/Junk folder for your request email from the email address administrator@grantinterface.com.
- Give your recommenders plenty of time to complete their tasks. Let them know what you need from them, and what they can expect. Don't wait until the last minute!
- Check your application to make sure that the information is submitted on your behalf. A gentle reminder is appropriate if they forget. You will also receive a confirmation email from the platform when a request is completed.
- Be sure to thank your recommenders for their help!

ACTIVITY RESUME

Each application requires an activities resume. This is much like a job resume that outlines your experiences. You may use any format, but make sure it is clear and readable (and include dates or years). You may wish to provide information for such activities as:

- Academic information - GPA, class rank, test scores, course selection, etc.
- Clubs and school activities - athletics, school leadership, academic teams, etc.
- Outside activities - 4-H, church, service groups, etc.
- Employment history
- Volunteer activities
- Honors and awards
- Other unique information

TIME MANAGEMENT

Nothing is more important in the scholarship process than completing the application thoroughly and on time. Be sure to begin the process well before the deadline and set up a schedule to work on various aspects as you go. Check in with your counselor and recommenders as needed, giving them plenty of time to complete the process. Your counselors especially will be working on things for a number of students. Be considerate of their time.

Review and edit each section carefully before you hit the SUBMIT button. Do not wait until the last day to complete your application. If you run into an issue (even if your computer crashes and it's not your fault) you will not be considered for any awards if you miss the deadline. **THINK AHEAD!**

BUILDING YOUR RESUME

Another Way to Stand Out in the Crowd

Creating a simple, one-page resume is a great way to quickly and easily share with scholarship reviewers the activities you have been involved in, the leadership positions you have held, any work experience you may have, and any honors or awards you have received. Building a resume for your scholarship applications is good practice for when you'll need to have a resume as you enter the workforce.

As you type your resume, remember these things:

- Use a standard font like Arial or Times New Roman at either 11 or 12 font size
- Keep your paragraph formatting and fonts consistent
- Use strong action verbs in a short overview of your activity/experience
- Proofread the entire document for spelling and proper verb tense usage

THE IMPORTANCE OF THANK YOU NOTES!



The Community Foundation of Madison & Jefferson County has been fortunate to have many generous donors create over 70 scholarship opportunities for local students. The Foundation thanks these donors for their monetary gifts at the time of the scholarship's creation, but the most important thank you that donors and their families can receive is from the winning student. They greatly appreciate thoughtful, hand-written thank you notes!

As you are writing your thank you note, in addition to expressing your appreciation for your scholarship, you may want to tell the donor family a little more about yourself. You could tell them where you're going to school, your intended major/minor, and why this award is important to you.

One last thing - ALL Community Foundation scholarship winners are **REQUIRED** to turn in completed thank you notes to the Community Foundation office (416 West Street, Suite B, Madison, IN) before any award money will be sent to the student's school.

P.S. - It's also a great idea to send hand-written thank you notes to anyone who may have helped you with your application. While you've got your pen and cards out, send a thank you to your counselors and anyone who wrote a letter of recommendation for you!

PAYING FOR COLLEGE



Scholarships are helpful, but many are for only the first year. What do I really need to know about how to finance my education?

What does college really cost?

The most common costs for most colleges include:

- Tuition - cost of classes
- Room - cost of dorm or housing
- Board - meal plan
- Fees - includes technology, supplies, etc. and varies by major

Check out a school’s website to see its cost. The good news is that most students don’t pay the “sticker price.”

Why are state schools so much less expensive?

These schools are supported by the state government, allowing a built-in scholarship for residents. Out-of-state students often pay much more. But, this doesn’t mean that private schools are more costly. Scholarships and aid given by private colleges often makes up for the difference in out-of-pocket costs.

How much debt might I expect?

In 2024, Indiana students leaving a four-year institution averaged over \$30,000 in debt. (source: Institute for College Access and Success)

What types of aid are available?

Federal/State:	Institutional Aid:	Private:
- Grants (not repaid)	- Usually grants	- Scholarships (like those from the Community Foundation)
- Loans (repaid with interest after leaving school)	- Most likely offered by private colleges	- Loans (often have higher repayment costs than government loans)
- Work Study (on-campus job with a paycheck)		

Isn’t it better to just live at home and commute?

Not always. Remember that you are still going to need to eat (board), and the cost of maintaining a car takes up a lot of the savings. Considering the extra time needed to commute and the experiences you miss by not living on campus, you might want to reconsider.

There is a lot to learn about paying for college – and everyone’s story is different. Do your research, take advantage of resources, check in with your counselor, and coordinate with your college’s Financial Aid Office. Don’t forget to fill out the FAFSA!

WHAT’S NEXT?

Now that you’re a senior, there’s a lot more to plan for than just Prom and Pep Rallies. Here are some important things to be working on and thinking about:

CHOOSE YOUR COLLEGE

- **What do you want?** Do you prefer a large or small campus? Close to home or far away? Do you have a major in mind? What “extras” are important? Check out the websites of many different schools before you narrow your list. Something may suprise you!
- **Make some visits.** Go to several campuses and meet with the Admissions folks. Sit in on a class, eat lunch with some students, and stay overnight when possible. Get the feel for what it means to be a student on this campus. Be sure to visit more than one place. How do you know a spot is right unless you have something to compare?
- **Don’t let money limit you.** Sticker shock for college is real, but luckily most people won’t pay the full amount. In addition to Community Foundation Scholarships, there are many other sources to help lessen the amount you will pay. File your FAFSA, apply for all available scholarships, and see what grants you will receive from the college itself.

APPLICATIONS

- **Get started.** Applications for college admission and applications for scholarships all have deadlines. Don’t miss out! Get going on your applications and keep a record of what you are doing and when.
- **Educate yourself.** Learn about all of the places you can go to earn money for college. Pay attention to annoucements and make yourself a regular visitor to the Guidance Office. Your counselor is an amazing resource!
- **Don’t skip essays or interviews.** Often students will avoid scholarship applications with these requirements, so this gives YOU a better chance. An extra hour or two of effort can end up earning you hundreds, even thousands of dollars!
- **Stand out.** Don’t write lame essays! Ask yourself what you can do to separate yourself from the crowd. Tell a story that will engage your reviewer rather than rehashing your resume like everyone else.

MAKE SOME DECISIONS

- **Set a timeline.** Senior year is busy! Be sure to give yourself enough time to fill out applications, make visits, and meet deadlines.
- **Notify others.** Be sure to contact schools to let them know your plans once final decisions are made. Get deposits in on time.
- **Don’t look back.** It’s natural to wonder “What if” about a different decision, but you will be happy where you decide to be happy! Enjoy the ride!





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
